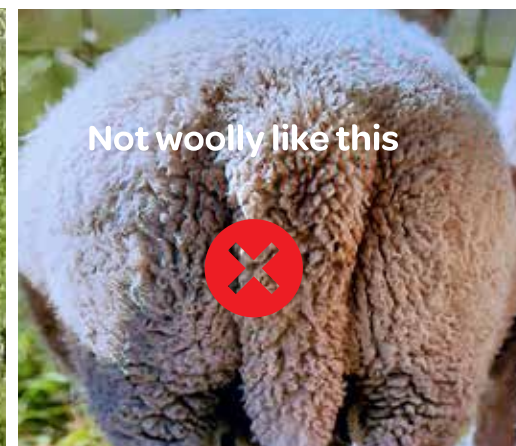
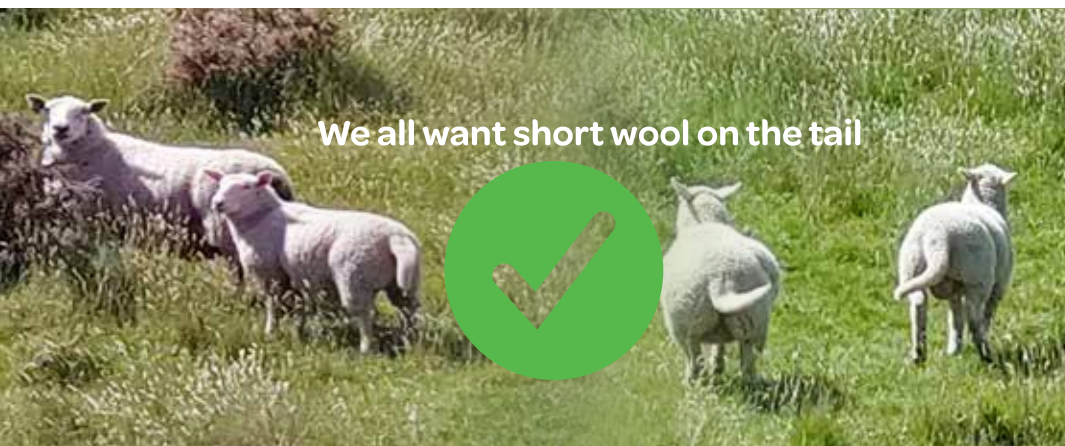
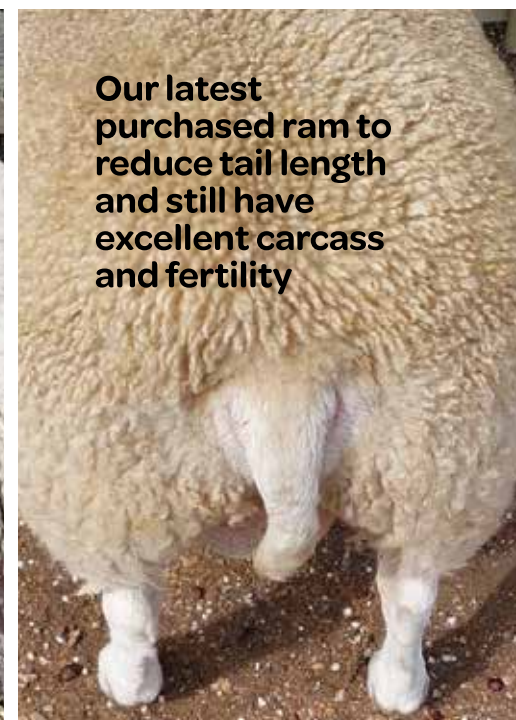


Has dedicated 20 years of selection to reduce dagging and crutching

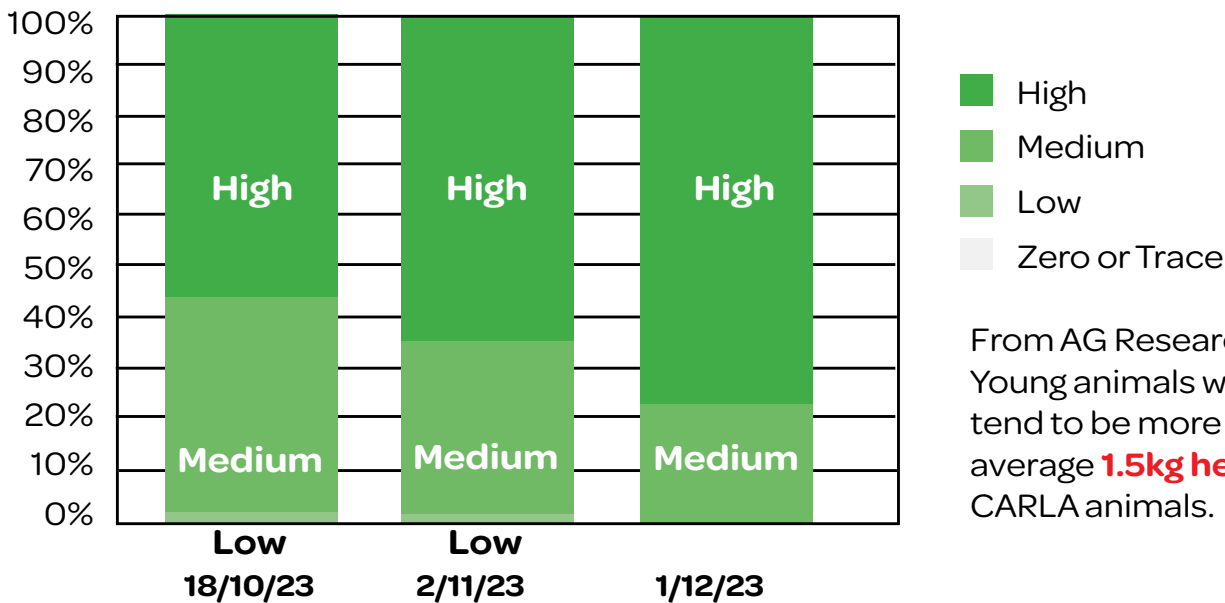
Snowline™ Genetics is placing **huge emphasis** on **"Worm Folerance"** so we can all successfully handle drench resistance on our farms in the future.

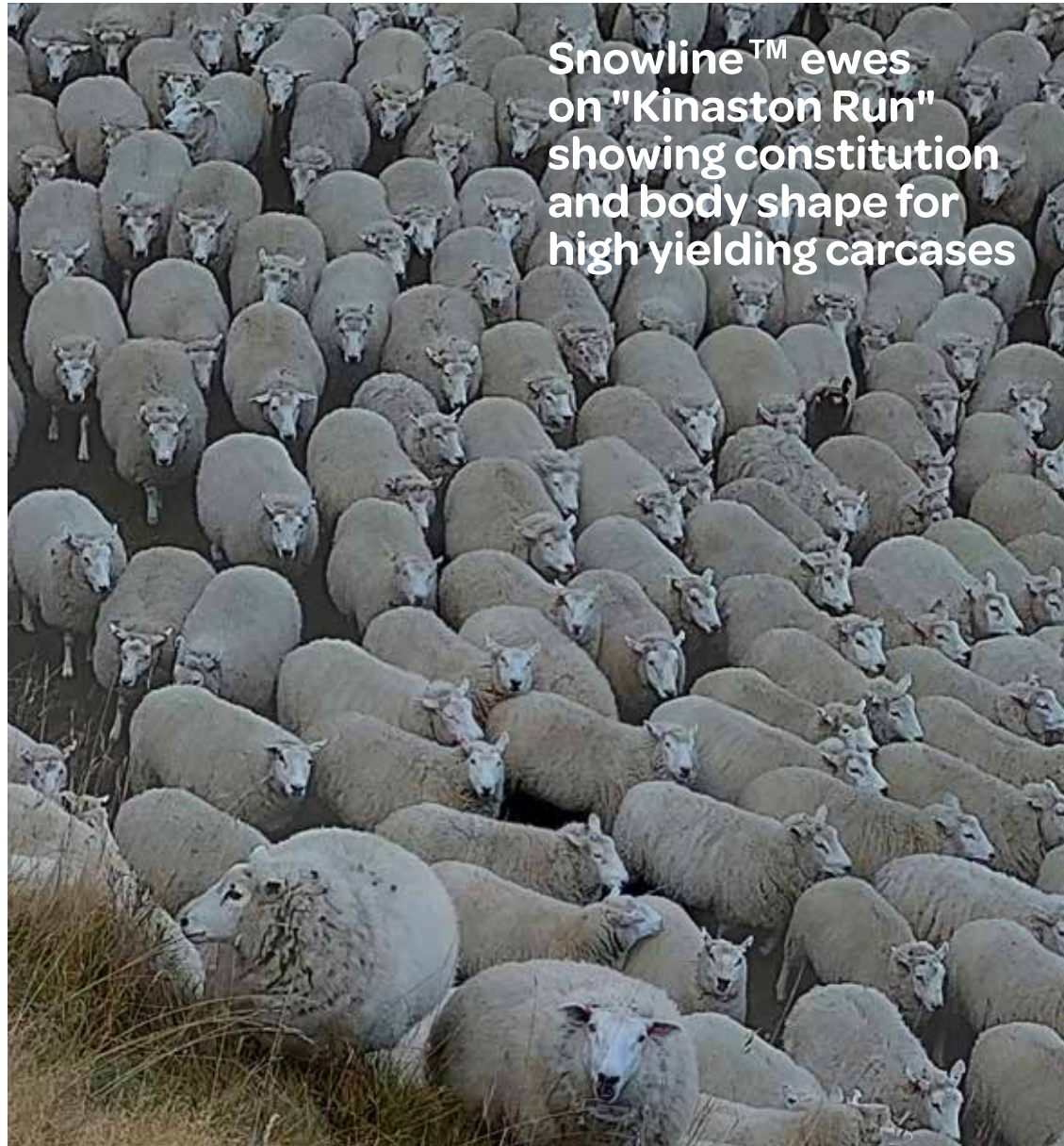
Please read this true story and join us to be proud again of being a New Zealand sheep farmer. We all need to **band together to support** our young farmers to get them through this difficult financial period.
